- Using full stops, capital letters and exclamation marks

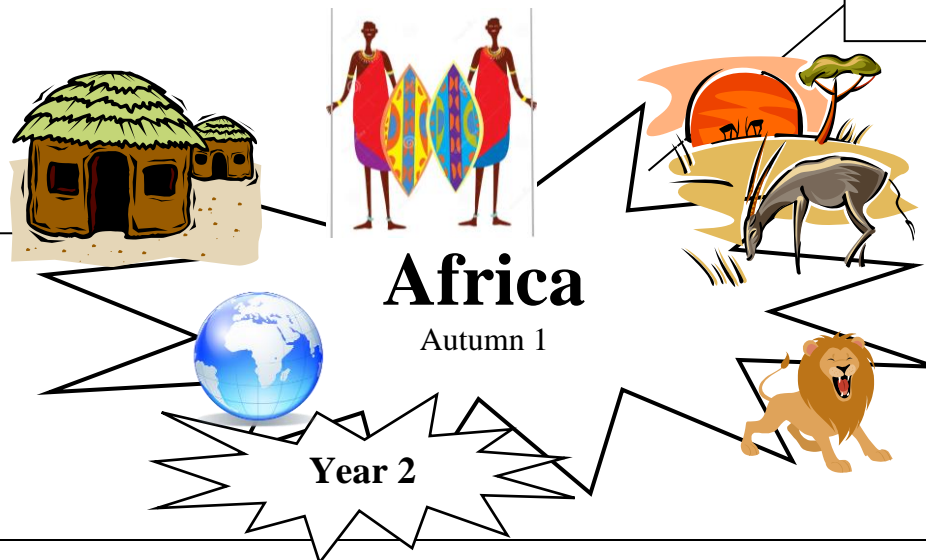
Here are some examples of some of the books we will explore: Masai and I/Mama Panya's Pancakes.
