Geography

- Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as other countries, continents and oceans
- Use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language [for example, near and far; left and right], to describe the location of features and routes on a map
- Devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key

Science

- Identify and name a variety of materials
- Describe the properties of different materials
- Investigate the best materials for various objects such as boats and shelters and life jackets
- To ask simple questions and perform simple tests to answer them.

Dance

- To explore movement ideas to create a pirate dance

Numeracy

Count forward and back to and across 100; be able to read and write numbers to 100 in numerals; count in multiples of 2, 5 and 10; identify 1 more and 1 less; interpret addition and subtraction number sentences; know addition and subtraction number facts within 20; solve 1 step word problems; recognise and find half and a quarter of objects, shapes and numbers; measure the length, mass and capacity of objects; measure time and tell the time to the hour and half past; recognise the value of different coins and notes; sequence events in chronological order; recognise language related to days, weeks, months and years; recognise and name common 2D and 3D shapes; describe the position, directions and movements of objects.
